Family Situation & Financial Need:

Rhagete Pryce is from a poor financial background where his father is now 75 years old and is no longer able to work full time and has problems with failing eyesight. While he worked, he was a bus driver and his mother sowed for the garment sector at Garmex , Marcus Garvey Drive. His mother no longer works.

Rhagete's parents were his main providers for the household.

Hence the financial resources to pay for Rhagete's medical schooling and daily family expenses is severely limited and depleted. His annual tuition is approx. J\$ 716,000 and he currently owes J\$ 347,800 tuition for this academic year (2022-23) after support from the Grace Kennedy

Foundation. In addition, he has meals and transportation expenses. He is hoping that he will be able to reside on campus soon, in order to complete his medical studies which now require long and late hours at UWI.

Rhagete lives off Waltham Park Road, just above Bay Farm Road so it is truly dangerous for him to travel home late at nights.
